## Global and Geography I and II

Grading will be based on a total points system. The total number of points available will vary each marking period. For example, if there were 580 total points available in a semester, and a student achieves 505 points, then that student's grade for the marking period would be an $88 \%(505 / 580=.88)$. Students will be given a grading sheet so they can keep track of their progress. Parents \& Students will also have access to check grades on Internet. Students will accumulate points with:

During: "warm up activities", "jeopardy", "lightening review", asking questions, tying in current events to topics
6. Map Tests - 25 points each

Map tests will be given frequently based of Monday maps given and may or
may-not relate to the topic we are covering at that point in time
7. Projects - 110 points each

Rubrics will be given when projects are assigned
8. Portfolio - Points Vary

1" Binder
